## 225<sup>th</sup> Recorded ANNUAL CONFERENCE of the Church of the Brethren

For over 250 years, Annual Conference has served a valuable role in the life of the Church of the Brethren, gathering to seek the mind of Christ on matters of common concern, mission and service. Much of the history has been recorded in decisions that formed how the Brethren lived out God's presence in their families, congregations, districts and the world. However, that history extends beyond the minutes of business to the more prayerful manner in which Brethren enter as they gather for Conference.

The Lancaster Church of the Brethren members and friends need to be in prayer for its delegates (Jeff Rill, Ellen Weaver and Jay Wenger) along with the Conference and the business that will be addressed. Be in prayer for Moderator, Robert Alley as he leads the delegates through the weighty issues of *Language on Same Sex Covenantal Relationships*; *A Statement of Confession & Commitment*; and a report of the *Congregation Ethics Study Committee*. New business will include two queries, one being: *Guidance for Responding to the Changing of Earth's Climate* and the other being: *Proper Decorum*.

This year's theme is: ***Gifted with Promise: Extending Jesus' Table***. Brethren encounter a challenging assignment: 1) to discover afresh their giftedness with the Gospel and 2) to envision their role in loving the world enough to share the physical and spiritual benefit of the Gospel. This theme connects our common interest in spirituality and service; practice and prayer. We extend the table with promised resources of grace and love. The theme calls us to mission and evangelism where we not only share and invite but we cultivate discipleship as we offer tangible resources of food, clothing, medical care and more. At the table we share, we receive, we learn.

## SUNDAY, JULY 17, 2011, WORSHIP SERVICES

The upgrade to our church organ will mean that the sanctuary worship space will be disrupted for Sunday, July 17, 2011. On that day, instead of holding the usual four worship services, we will hold two all-church worship services in the Family Life Center—the first at 8:30 a.m., the second at 10:15 a.m. In both worship services there will be elements of traditional and contemporary worship. Anointing will be offered in both services for anyone who longs for healing and wholeness in body, mind, spirit, relationship with God and/or relationship with others.

Let us gather to celebrate our diversity and foster community as we praise God with one voice.

**My Heart Leapt Within Me.** It's a common idiom, precisely because it happens to us all. *"My heart leapt within me!"* If you want an interesting study, try entering that phrase into Google. You will see hearts leaping for all manner of reasons, from religious devotion to happenings on a favorite TV show! The one thing in common is that it always seems to denote an upwelling of joy or passion. It is a real physical phenomenon tied to our deepest feelings.

It's hard to know where the idiom began. Like so many popular idioms of a spiritual nature, it's easy to assume that it comes from the Bible, but using the text search feature of several online Bible versions I did not find the phrase. Perhaps Wordsworth's poem "My Heart Leaps Up When I Behold" helped popularize it – in only 9 lines, that poem also gave us "The child is father to the man."

I've been thinking about the phrase lately, on the occasion of our 33<sup>rd</sup> wedding anniversary. Mary Ellen has been doing some business travel, and I've been picking her up at the Baltimore airport. You wait, and wait, and then... *there she is!* And my heart leaps, literally – a little surge of joy at seeing her after several days absence.

Given my line of work, you won't be surprised that many of my "leaping heart" moments are tied to music. Some works are very reliable in lifting me out of the moment, and into a sense of joy and spiritual awareness. Try almost anything by Morten Lauridsen – *Lux Aeterna* is a good start. And, working with our fine adult ensembles, I find my heart often leaps up for joy at their efforts! It's a sense of gratitude and praise to God for their musical expressions.

When, as an adult, I first really read Micah 6:8 with intention and understanding, my heart leapt. The verse reads, *"...and what doth the LORD require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?"* I remember so clearly how my heart leapt on reading those words! I thought, "I can do that!" What's more, I wanted to do it!

It seems to me that the words of Micah 6:8 constitute "marching orders" for the Church of the Brethren. Leave to others the doctrinal divides and the search for power and control. Our task is to love deeply, and from that love to spring into action for service, always walking humbly with God.

Wordsworth's poem concludes, "And I could wish my days to be / Bound each to each by natural piety." May that be our wish also, as we walk humbly in service!

# OUTREACH OPPORTUNITIES

## THE ANGELS HAVE RETURNED

Mr. Ken Marzinko, Facilitator of the Homeless Student Project for the School District of Lancaster (SDL), says that he anticipates well over 1000 homeless students during the 2011-2012 school year.

Our congregation has worked with the SDL for the past three years. The first two years, we focused on school supplies, and last year we added school uniforms. During July and August of last year, we provided 375 uniforms (750 items of clothing), for a retail value of \$7,500. In addition, we gave over \$500 worth of traditional school supplies. Mr. Marzinko was deeply moved by our caring and generosity.

This July and August, we will again focus on school uniforms, but traditional school supplies (book bags, notebooks, rulers, glue, etc.) will be welcome as well.

### **What's needed?**

Girls: Khaki skirts, shorts, or skorts with white or blue polo shirts;

Boys: Khaki pants and or/shorts, with white or blue polo shirts.



## Practical Advice about Giving

4. **If you want to begin to actively give to God FIRST:** Here are four different ideas to choose from: (1) Whenever you get any money, set aside 10% or more to give as the Lord directs. (2) Whenever you put a deposit in your checkbook, write out the first check(s) to God's work for 10% or more. (3) If you track your finances through a bookkeeping system or computer program, set up a category for church giving and another one for other Christian causes. Then begin to faithfully set aside 10% or more of your income into these accounts. (4) If you like to handle your finances electronically, consider using [www.networkforgood.org](http://www.networkforgood.org) or the electronic giving option from your church (if available) to faithfully give 10% or more to the Lord.

5. **If you are married to a Christian, but the two of you do not agree on how much you should give to the Lord's work:** See if your spouse will read through this material and/or listen to some of the internet messages at [www.MAXIMUMgenerosity.org](http://www.MAXIMUMgenerosity.org) or this website. Then talk and pray together about a mutually agreeable "testing period" concerning your giving 10% or more.

6. **If you are married and your spouse is not a Christian:** Identify any money you have freedom to spend (read Luke 8:3) and set aside 10% or more of this money to give to the Lord's work AND/OR show this material to your spouse and see if you can try the 90-day testing period.





# GIVE THEM ROOTS AND GIVE THEM WINGS

How are our High School and College Graduates doing? And what are they doing after having ventured into the world?

The church helps to nurture spirit and teach faith as they grow up, but when they leave our close care it's good to keep in touch and learn how they have been able to take faith with them away from home.

Kesley Murray is one who is continuing to serve and take opportunities to share her spiritual gifts. Kelsey is serving on the **Young Adult Steering Committee** which just had a conference at Camp Inspiration Hills, in Burbank, Ohio. About 75 young adults from across the denomination participated. The theme was Re: Thinking Church. She was a little nervous because this was her first Young Adult Conference (since the ages span from 18 to 35), but came back really excited! This is a 3 year commitment (she just ended her 1st year) which entails a trip to the denominational offices in Elgin, Illinois for a planning session once a year. This fall they will start planning for National Young Adult Conference with an on-site meeting at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, where NYAC will be next summer. She will also have monthly conference calls. It seemed like the conference was a really good networking opportunity for young adults.

Kelsey attends **Bridgewater College** in Harrisonburg, VA. She is a member of the **Brethren Student Movement** which meets once a week for a small devotional, community building, and just to have some fun. Since being at Bridgewater, she was asked to serve on the board that plans the yearly events for the Brethren Student Movement group and will serve on that until she graduates. Also she is active in the **New Community Project** Chapter (an eco friendly/social justice group), and the **Environmental Task Force** that was started on campus this spring semester. She has a work-study job with the chaplain as his assistant. She will help with Thursday morning chapel, organize a group for chapel this upcoming year, and other jobs. Kelsey is working for the school newspaper

starting this year and will be doing some photography and layout design. Next Interterm (January), she is taking a course called Lands of the Bible and will **travel to Israel, Palestine, and Jordan for three weeks** with the chaplain and a small group of students. This summer Kelsey is home and working at a Manheim Township pool in the snack bar and at the skating rink.
