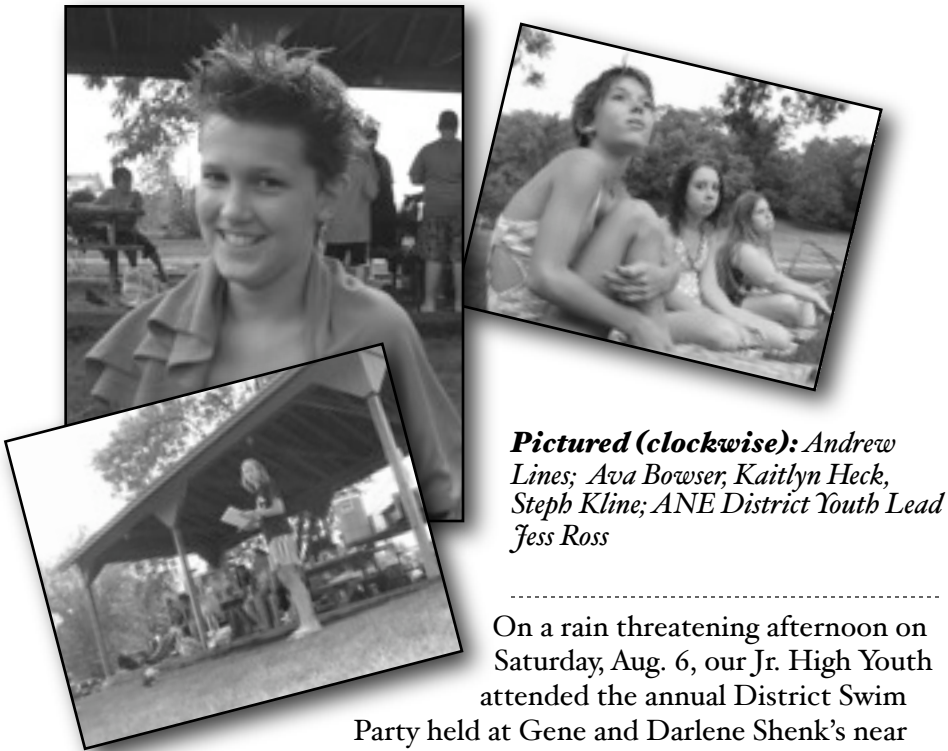


Youth News

Sr. High Summer

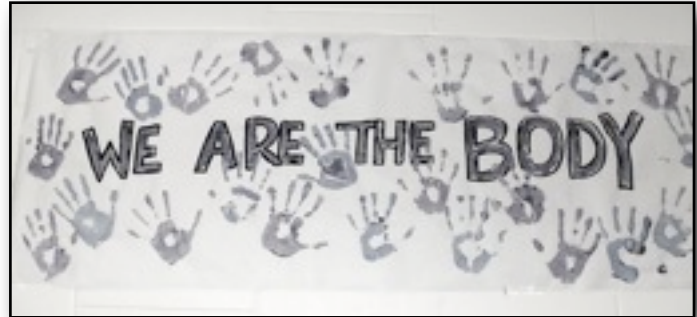

Christian Citizenship Seminar - 2012

Sr High Youth - You need to know by **Dec. 1** if you are interested and able to go to the Christian Citizenship Seminar held in **New York City And Washington D.C. - April 14-19, 2012.** (check with your school - some Junior Classes are required to take the PSSA's during this time) YOU must register online on Dec. 1 - there are only 100 openings for youth and advisors so they fill quickly. **Cost is \$125 per youth** (total cost is \$375 - church covers 2/3) **Youth attending will be expected to present a report on the event when returning.** It will be included in our Youth Sunday Service in May.

Ashley Kline attended last years Seminar and you can ask her about the experience. Cost includes 5 nights stay (three in New York City and two in Washington); dinner on the opening evening of the seminar (all other meals are at your cost); transportation from NYC to Washington DC. Each participant

needs to bring additional money for meals, sightseeing and subway/ taxi fares to get to and from the lodging to the seminars. There is some free time to spend in the city and youth come from all around the country to participate.

This coming years CCS will emphasis our "Carbon Footprint" in the world. CCS is held every year there is not a National Youth Conference and every year the seminar topic is different but related to our Christian response to world issues.
