The ministry of caring for those caught in the world of hunger and poverty will continue as a vital part of the Outreach Ministry Team in 2010. Listed below you will find some of the ways in which we can be the change Gandhi might have had in mind.

“2 Cents a Meal” offerings for the Lancaster County Council of Churches (LCCC), and our denomination’s Global Food Crisis Fund. The next “2 Cent” offering is scheduled for February 7.

Collection of food for the LCCC Food Bank. As you know, the early Christians brought food for the hungry each time they served Communion.

Bread and Cup Communion—Feb. 21, May 23, & Nov. 28

Love Feast—April 1 & Oct. 3

Food distribution at Church Street Towers the third Wednesday each month.

Collection of clothing and blankets for LCCC. This will be an on-going effort.

Supplies/Funds for homeless school children in Lancaster. This will be a major focus in the late summer.

New ministry possibilities are being explored and you will be kept informed as they develop.

The biblical theme that continues to haunt and inspire us is the passage in Matthew 25. The people wanted to know when they had seen the Master hungry, thirsty, a stranger, naked, sick, or in prison and ministered to him. The response likely surprised them as it does us: Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these . . . , you did it to me” (Matthew 25:40). --Outreach Ministry Team

Well, it is February! It seems Christmas was just yesterday and now February is here with the beginning of Lent. We often speak of fasting during Lent. We speak of “giving up” something for Lent. Why do we do that, and is it really fasting? Perhaps Lent is a time to take a closer look at fasting.

People fasted in the Bible in response to some grievous event – like death or the realization of sin or when the nation was threatened. Fasting is the response of a person to an often painful grievous sacred moment. Does it get results? Yes, at times, but that is not the point of fasting. Fasting is a response to a sacred moment such as death, sin, fear, threat, needs, sickness, etc... Results may come as deeper life, forgiveness, rescue, hope, grace, or health.

The Bible presents a responsive view of fasting. Fasting is not just a bodily experience, it is spirit and body. We are one person with an inner and outer dimension. Fasting is about joining the material to the immaterial, the body to the soul, the body to the spirit in a unified, organic act.

When people give up watching TV for Lent, that is not fasting but abstinence. Fasting is a response to some sacred moment or task ahead, when we choose to avoid physical indulgence of food for a period of time in order to focus attention on God.

Fasting connects us to God’s perspective in a grievous sacred moment. Fasting enables us to identify with and empathize with God...God’s *pathos*, grieving with God. Fasting is a response to a sacred moment and not an instrument to get what we want. Amy Frykholm concluded that “Fasting is about three things: attentiveness, compassion and freedom.” Attentiveness to God’s tears, compassion for those who suffer as well as in our own suffering, and freedom to experience God’s love, healing, forgiveness, grace and joy.

If you choose to fast during Lent this year, do so in response to God’s grieving for the world and the suffering of all of us. Brokenness is sacred...Jesus is the bread broken for us and in that grievous moment of his crucifixion we respond by fasting for all he grieved for. In our fasting may we find healing.

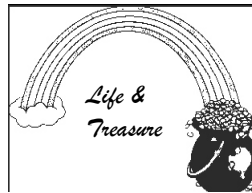

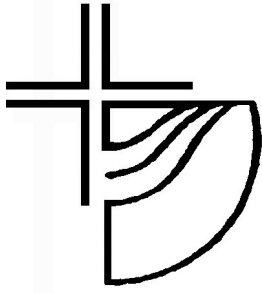
Senior High
