## District Service Project

*Sign up by April 8, Easter Sunday*

The Atlantic Northeast District Youth will again meet together to work at GAIN, Saturday, April 21, beginning at 9:00 am. GAIN is the Global Aid Network and they are located in Mt Joy. This organizations partners with local churches, missionaries and other agencies to help distribute compassionate aid to impoverished countries around the world. They also work to mobilize mission teams to distribute the aid and respond to disasters. In addition their goal is to support medical missions, help with orphan care and bring evangelistic outreach to the places they serve.

This opportunity for youth to help is for both Junior High and Senior High (and friends are welcome too). After arriving at the Distribution Center we will be assigned to work at various stations. This center operates year-round in receiving, processing and packing the items needed to be shipped overseas. Because this is warehouse work, everyone will need to be sure to wear close toed shoes (no sandals or flip-flops). Around noon we will gather for lunch (most likely pizza) and there will be a presentation for us all to learn more about the work of GAIN.

Those who live close to the facility at 1506 Quarry Road in Mt Joy can meet us there. If we have enough who would like to travel together from the church, we will meet in the parking lot Sat. morning at 8:15. There are two forms that need to be signed for youth to participate. One was distributed in mailboxes at church. This form MUST be returned to Linda by April 8. The other form is the usual ANE Activity Release form that needs a parent signature and can be brought to the event. EVERYONE must register with Linda by April 8 to attend. ### Love is a Growing Pain

A father shared with us once at a Little League game that his very athletic young son had suddenly become a complete klutz. He was bumping into things and tripping and falling down stairs. Someone might think that he had a medical problem but, the reality was - he was growing. He had grown several inches taller and increased his shoe size - two sizes - in a very short amount of time. How his brain judges distances in walking and moving had not caught up to the new size of his feet and the length of his legs. What was once easy, was now challenging. Where he was once graceful and accurate at running and throwing, he was now clumsy and unpredictable. The change was there for him to grow in size and stature but his brain needed to learn how to react differently to this new reality.

It can be a little painful to watch. Where one time something was fun because it was easy - now it had become challenging and frustrating. Everyone goes through these frustrations at some time.

Parents don't enjoy frustrated teens (not one does) Where children learn to cry and sulk, some teens tend to settle on anger as a way to cope with frustrations. Loud angry words, rolling eyes, dirty looks, stomping away, slamming doors, clenched jaws - most parents have experienced some form of this teenage wrath and these are growing pains too.

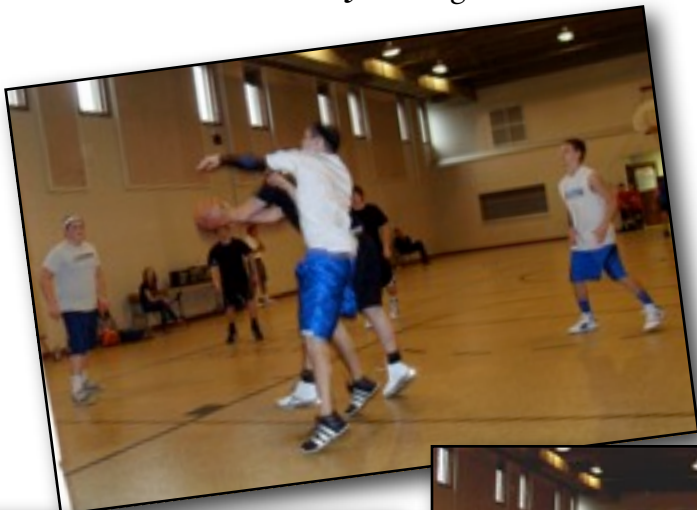
It is a painful reality to learn you don't control the world (it's not all about me) - It is a painful frustration to find that your time is not your own (others depend on me) - it is a painful annoyance that we must learn to live in community with others and consider their well being too (what I do affects others).

These pains can challenge teens - and adults. To grow, we need to learn a better way to react to the ever changing circumstances of our reality. Wasting energy in being angry and staying stuck in annoyance don't benefit our growth. In our faith journey we should strive to 'grow our thoughts' to include the love Christ teaches. This love should lead us to better understand how to react. Paul teaches, in 1 Corinthians 13:4-7, a way to know we are reacting in love. You may not be able to instantly change your reality but you do have the power to change your mind. Grow in love and watch your growing pains disappear.
