Change For Weds Nights

Something old is something new again - sort of. Beginning Wednesday January 25 when WNL meals begin at church again, we are planning to change the activities a bit for both the Jr and Sr High. This evening event has a history of being many things and the YMOT continues to evaluate and discern the use of this ministry time for our youth.

The church has used this time in the past as choir time, youth club time, Bible study time, teaching time (to learn cooking, music lessons and knitting and so on). The youth time had evolved this into "Hang out Time" most recently but we changed this in the fall to try to allow for youth with many interests. The hope was, if youth liked sports - they may be more interested in attending a "ball night" more than a "game night" or if youth liked going to something with a purpose they could try "service night". Or there was challenge night to meet with other youth groups and/or do some more physical games.

So, Weds. nights have always been particularly challenging to be sure the church is offering a time of good fellowship that engages youth but is also a ministry.

The meal time is also a part of the reason people come to church on a Weds. night. That was intended to encourage families to take time at least once a week to come and sit together for a meal and to build our community of faith by hosting many generations to share around the table. It's not supposed to be about what they are serving that night - but what we can get from spending time together.

So, in this long winded answer is the reason for the change we will try for Weds. nights. Again, just as in the

fall, we will continue to evaluate and discuss change and effectiveness of ministry. Weds. night will make a leap to go back to some intent to try to engage both youth and families. For youth - this will be more like going back to "Hang Out Night" the addition will be that games - board games and our in room table games will also be open for youth and families to share. Come and play a game of pool or fussball.

If youth have need to do homework, the rooms (Jr High and Sr High) will be open for that too. If you just want to sit around and chat with others, that's great too.

Soup Bowl Painting
