There is nothing like celebrating New Year's Eve two times. That's what happened for the youth who came to the "NOT New Year's Eve Party" at the church on December 28-29. Because it is the holiday season and families often have plans for the actual New Year's Eve - we moved up the party. It was like having two birthday's too, for Odett Rodriguez, who really does celebrate her birthday on January 1.

Eight youth were able to attend and four dedicated parents were there to brave the night, at least until just after midnight for some.

The evening began by playing with the life size Angry Birds game set up in the Family Life Center. Youth took turns lobbing playground balls painted like Angry Bird's characters at the more than 40 cardboard boxes set up to topple. The set up included the evil green pigs made from paper globe lanterns. The slingshot was an auto cargo net strung between volleyball poles. It all worked relatively well as we tweaked a few things. Two teams then formed to compete against each other. One team would set the boxes to make scoring more difficult and the other team would try to break their plan.



At 11:30 we paused for a Bible lesson about the physics of God. Talking about leaning not on our own understanding and building on a solid foundation. (verses from Proverbs and Matthew). Pizza arrived and all "pigged out" (an Angry Birds reference) before the midnight countdown. Fireworks were to begin at 12:00 but we had a short delay until the Police Officer left. (it's good to know our silent alarm is working - just wish the late shift at the security office would have gotten the memo) It was good to get the OK from the officer to proceed with the fireworks display.

Next we retired up stairs for popcorn and an Old 70's Scrooge movie that Linda likes (it worked - put the youth right to sleep! - well not all) After the movie, Sue Lines and Linda Byers stayed with the girls in the Sr High room while the guys stayed in the Jr High room where Dave Byers kept watch (not really - He was out like a light!) In the AM - we had a little breakfast and the youth helped to tear down the boxes and set up the room for Sunday services.



It was a fun way to bring in the New Year - even if it was a few days early.

Sr High Youth Time - Shoots for a Goal

Playing basketball is a big part of what several of our Sr High youth like to do together. Youth Time meets once a month (usually the first Sunday of the month). There is time to eat together and Tim Heck leads the group in the FLC for some court time. The first 30 minutes of our meeting, the group has been forming a plan for a project to support a charity. Several months ago the conclusion was to support the Lancaster County Council of Churches Food Bank. At the January 6th meeting they decided to use the event "Souper Bowl of Caring" as the way to raise funds. Many church youth groups (including many Brethren Churches) have become regular supporters of this event. In fact, this year the entire denomination is encouraging our youth to participate in the event.

On Feruary 3, the day of the Super Bowl, our Sr High Youth will be waiting at the doors of the church as the congregation exits each service. The Youth will be holding large soup pots and waiting for folks to share by dropping in their donations. (Cash or checks made out to LCoB) **Some youth have already suggested they may make this a competition to see who gets the most donations that morning.**

On the following Sunday, February 10, we will again be asking for donations. This time in the form of canned goods as people enter for Soup and Salad.

There are several youth committing to volunteer for this project. Cory Betz will write an article for the church news letter. Connor Snyder created a table sign to let people at our spaghetti meal know more about the February plan. Chris Holsinger will also announce it at the meal.

We have most of the exit doors covered with two volunteers on the day of the event (February 3) - posted outside the Chapel at 8:30 - Cory Betz. After the early Morning Psalm service (around 10:00) Lukas Murray and Connor Snyder will be at the Heritage Center doors. Traditional Service should be covered at three exits at 11:00 - Chris Holsinger and Colin Betz (at the exit door facing Sunset Avenue), Cory Betz and Justin Shertzler (at the Gathering Place sanctuary doors). The second Morning Psalm service exit at 11:00 will be Shane Heck and Alex Bookman.

We are still in need of volunteers to stand at the sanctuary door that leads to the parking lot at 11:00 and it would be good to have another youth at the Chapel doors at 8:30. (let Linda know if you are willing and able) **We will need additional youth to serve in collecting cans on Feb. 10 at Soup and Salad (just as folks come in)**

After this event is complete we still are planning to meet for Youth Time in March and April. Our discussion time will need to change to begin plans for Youth Sunday on May 5.

Youth not interested in playing basketball, the youth room will be open to play pool, games or ping-pong ONLY if there are enough adults to supervise. Safe Church calls for two adults present for all activities. We can always use MORE volunteers! Volunteers do not need to pay for lunch but all do need to sign up by the Friday before.

Sr High Ski Trip to Big Boulder

February 23, Sr High will spend a day on the slopes. We will leave from the Church parking lot by 8:00AM. Be sure to bring money for Breakfast at McDonald's on the way up. Cost of a lift ticket is \$50 and ski or snowboard rentals will be \$32 - this does not include the tax. (helmet rental is \$12 extra) Price is a little less for youth under 16. Youth will be responsible for their own payment. We can expect (if weather conditions are good) to stay at the slopes until 4:30. From there we are invited to dinner at the cabin with Doug and Donna Lunger before heading home. Youth can also bring along dry clothes for the ride home. **We will be in need of another adult to travel along - to ski, snowboard or catch up on a book in the lodge.** The trip - of course, is weather permitted. If we get a blizzard or ice, we'll need to evaluate the risk. E-mail sign up will be forwarded two weeks before the trip.
