December 15 Baptism

The Lancaster congregation has been holding baptism regularly around the time of Palm Sunday in the spring. (and most likely this will be offered again in April 2014) We say “offered” because it is a free choice and there are several steps the church and baptismal candidates need to take prior to jumping in (not literally of course).

There was a time when youth considering the commitment would enroll in lessons as a group to learn about church history, hear about the call to be baptized and what membership in a congregation means. Baptism is a very individual choice, so currently we wait for individuals to request this rite of the church. After that we begin the conversation about all of those things. Church history we try to touch on during Sunday School each year.

Most youth thinking about baptism may begin with questions - who do I want to model my life after?, what does taking this step mean?, where do I see myself and God in the future?, why is membership in a church important to me?, and how do I witness to others a commitment I have made in my heart? Sometimes youth start asking questions of parents or youth directors and some times parents start the conversation to ask the youth about faith and life direction. Either way, it's an important subject to bring up within a family.

Important to remember is that the act of baptism is the start of a journey. Baptism is recognizing the point at which we begin to make choices that will welcome Christ to be with us as a guide in our future.

The practical side of the church offering baptism in December is - it takes a lot of hot water to fill the pool in the church and when we do - we want to welcome everyone to think about “jumping in”. The Maranatha Fellowship have several members preparing for the experience so we are inviting all to join the event.

Thanks to youth who spoke at Love Feast: Drew Smith, Alex Bookman and Jack Smith.

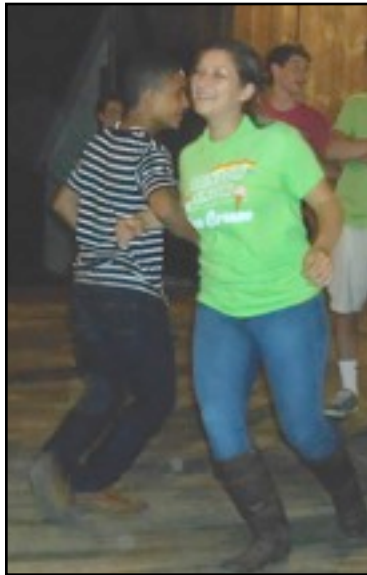
Thanks to Renea Snyder and Mark Forsha for teaching the Jr High class.
