## SOLD - Soup Bowl Auction Success!

Our February Soup and Salad continued to collect funds for youth Work Camps but, at the end of the meal, our auctioneering family (The Snyder's: Mike, Connor and Renea as clerk) took the stage to call for the bids. We had 18 ceramic soup bowls painted by both Jr. and Sr. High youth. Two additional hand-thrown bowls were donated by the Murray's (created by Kelsey Murray- student at Bridgewater College). The youth had two options of where the money for the sale of their bowl would be donated. Nine bowls sold to help support Heifer International and the other 11 helped the Lancaster County Council of Churches Food Bank. The bowls had been on display in the Gathering Place and the Heritage Center the week before they went on the block, thanks to Carol Shearer who artistically arranged them. By the time the bowls were moved to the stage of the family life center many people had picked their favorites and were ready to get started.

As the meal was winding down and everyone had been served, our Jr. High Youth assembled to help show the bowls to the waiting crowd seated at tables. Thanks to: Ava and Sadie Bowser, Drew and Jack Smith, Alex Nye, Paige Snyder, Maria Ramirez, Gabby Rodriguez for helping walk around the room to display the works of art. During the meal congregation members were encouraged to acquire a bid number from John or Sue Lines to get ready to buy a bowl.

Each bowl was artfully described by Connor Snyder before it was sold. Connor takes his cues from have

watched and helped his father auction. No doubt, the descriptions added to the fun of the day and the final bid amount of each bowl. Youth had been invited to give their painted master piece a title. Some art included scripture verse or references to faith and love. Others were uniquely named for their design. One artist title seemed to be most unique and combined design and faith references in it's title:

"Blessed Cheetah in the Water" (thanks to Andrew Lines creativity).

The most competitive bids of the day went to a bowl sold about halfway through the lot and the last bowl to be sold. The piece by Gabriella Rodriguez titled "Winter Swirl" caught the eye of many bidders. The bid quickly rose to \$160 and was awarded to John Herr. The last bowl to be sold for the first time was one Hand-thrown by Kelsey Murray and again the bid exploded quickly to \$160 to go to Deb Chillias. Any bowl that sold under \$30 that day was a steal for most averaged more. Two bowls were donated back to be sold again to raise more money.

The bowl auction alone brought \$1,086 in total bids. Our total donation for the day, including the table funds for the Soup and Salad meal, were over \$2,207. THANKS to EVERYONE who came out for our event and who gave to support the youth. Your encouragement and excitement to donate teaches a lesson to youth about great giving and using our own gifts and talents to help others. Because of you our youth will be able to donate \$750 to the Food Bank and \$400 to Heifer International. What a Blessing!.
